MAZEK VIRTUAL PERFORMANCE



INSPIRED BY BEKSINSKI

To write another post, I was inspired by an interview with the painter, Zdzislaw Beksinski (post "Inspired by Beksinski"). One of Beksinski's statements gave me a clue in the direction of developing my life motto. The Polish painter stated that if you have to wait for the end of the life and fulfill the meaninglessness of your existence, it is better to spend your life in comfortable conditions sitting on an armchair, than sitting on a cactus. I, Adam Mazek, unlike Beksinski, believe that our life has a meaning that is unknown to us. Nevertheless, I agree with the dead genius that it is better to spend a comfortable life than being tormented during one's life. I believe that life should be as flexible as possible.

For example, Zdzisław Beksiński moved from his hometown - Sanok - to Warsaw. He did it because, in communist Poland, it was easier for him to sell his works while being in the capital than in the south-eastern part of the country. This fact was in line with what Beksinski said in an interview. What's more, it is also in line with the message of Seneca and Bruce Lee, which I mentioned in the "Diaries" of December 2017. All three of the abovementioned gentlemen want to tell us a similar thought: try to adapt to what fate will bring you, and do not treat the blows inflicted on you as attacks. Seneca added that we should thank the enemy for the experience he gave us. In turn, we treat our defeats as lessons, not as losers. We should not be afraid of risk or failure. In the end, we will all die anyway. Let's not waste our precious time and energy on senseless and worthless actions or skirmishes.








IN WHAT SHOULD WE INVEST?

BARTON FINK

Creating new things brings happiness and joy, not only to the soul but also to our hearts and mind. That is why "Barton Fink" scared me so much. The main character of this black comedy is thriving as a promising playwright on Broadway, New York. He then receives a lucrative offer from one of Hollywood's producers. He moves to Los Angeles, and his creative spirit disappears. He can't write anything. This is how the story of the Coen brothers begins. I think that lack of creative inspiration and inability to create (regardless of whether you are a painter, musician, dancer, or another artist) is one of the worst things that artists can encounter.

WHY MY PICTURES ARE "SAD"?

About why my photos can be "sad," I wrote in the next text entitled "Why my pictures are "sad"?" For me, my images are not "sad." They can introduce different states of mind to the recipient, not necessarily the positive ones. The perception will be mostly dependent on the mood and experience of the viewer. It largely determines how it will transform the impression of a given work in its mind and imagination. Nevertheless, the fact is that I want my images not always to evoke pleasant feelings in the viewer's imagination. Why? I think that the most valuable works of art can bring the viewer not necessarily positive emotions and good memories. Let's look at the paintings of Hieronymus Bosch, Salvador Dali, or Zdzislaw Beksinski. Did they paint a calm and rural landscape? Let's try to recall such films as "Midnight Cowboy" by John Schlesinger, "Barton Fink" by the Coen brothers, or "Tenant" by Roman Polanski. Should I mention farther? Here you are!

Read the novels of Dostoevsky or Lem and understand how little we know about ourselves (despite the constant development of science). Read Seneca and realize that life is precious in a lot of pain. It is a pain that helps us develop. It makes us stronger, and we go through life straight with our heads up. Also listen, my Dear Friend, songs of David Bowie ("Space Oddity" or "Warsaw"), R.E.M. or Sting. By the way, the last two music bands have exceptions in their melancholic works. "Shiny Happy People" performed by the group R.E.M. and Sting's "Love Is The Seventh Wave" are real masterpieces. They are "happy" songs on a master level. They show us that "cheerful" music (and broadly understood art) can be a real masterpiece.
