
CONTINUAL DROPPING WEARS AWAY A STONE



In the post "Inspired by Bosch," I focused on one of the triptychs of the outstanding Dutch painter Hieronymus Bosch, called "The Haywain." Over the centuries, Bosch has inspired generations of artists. His paintings encouraged the creation of strange, unusual, and terrifying works of art. In English terminology, the term Boschian has even been coined to describe fantastic, surreal, and scary works from all areas of art. Hieronymus Bosch specialized in painting the inhabitants of hell. In his paintings, the hellish depths are inhabited by people, animals, plants, and hybrids of these creatures. Let's take a closer look at the characters from the painting "The Haywain." We see, for example, a hooded man with branches growing from his back. Another terrifying character is a fish with human legs that swallows a human body. The Dutch master, in his work, manifested a unique imagination that invariably fascinates people.

WHY DO i LOVE WALKING?




Post "Why do I love walking?"



INSPIRED BY DALI

The last post, published in May 2018, was called "Inspired by Dali." The truth is, I was inspired by Salvador Dali's work, thanks to a book written by Robert Descharnes and Gilles Néret called "Dali. The Paintings", published by Taschen publishing house. One of the excerpts from the book caught my attention. It presents the painter's attitude to the Spanish Civil War. The famous artist admitted that he was not a historian. He even stated that he was both anti-historic and apolitical. Dali noted that the Spanish Civil War did not affect his artistic ideas and way of thinking. The Spanish genius was averse to any kind of revolution. When the war mentioned above broke out, Dali did not react in any way. He wanted people to look at him, and his works only through his person's prism, not the circumstances in which he was given to live.Nevertheless, public opinion demanded that the Spanish surrealist decide whether he was a supporter of Stalin or Hitler. In his biography, the famous Spanish painter wrote that he was, is, and will be, until his death, Salvador Dali and nothing else. He did not believe in communism, the National Socialist revolution, or any other political system. Dali only believed in himself.

Coups and revolutions were attractive to the Spanish painter in only one aspect: they retrieved fragments of a tradition that were considered dead because they had already been forgotten. The famous artist added that for him, all the Spanish Civil War people - atheists, believers, communists, fascists - fought with exceptional courage and pride. Personally, I don't want to write about wars. Nevertheless, like Salvador Dali, I would like to have my own unique style in creating art. Contrary to the Spanish genius, my tools for expressing myself are photography, the website, and "Journals." I wish my works would represent 100% of my thoughts and beliefs. I want to describe and express myself.What's more, I would also like to present, reinterpret, and comment on the world and the people around me, through the prism of my own experiences, knowledge, and feelings seething inside me. The dream is to leave a permanent, artistic trace of my activity to posterity to inspire them to their own creative action. Salvador Dali's works inspire people from all over the world thirty years after his death. I am convinced that they will inspire us three hundred years after the death of the Spanish genius. I believe in myself and my activities, and I hope that my work will inspire others during my life and after my death. I do intend to represent myself and my views only in my life.
