






## TIME OF PROSPERITY AND ECONOMIC CRISIS

The room where the image appears on the wall "upside down" must be dark for the phenomenon to be visible. All such experiments had to be performed in darkrooms.

#### (c) Eadweard Muybridge's photographic work.

His photographs of horses captured movement dynamism in a way unknown to anyone in the 19th century. Muybridge pioneered the visual study of the physical movement of animals and humans.




d) Leonardo da Vinci's artistic activities.


Why did you add more work to your daily routine when you didn't want extra pressure?

## QUOTATION
